We appreciate your willingness to organize with us as we work to create safer conditions for our neighborhoods and eliminate situations that cause an unnecessary risk of fire and threaten personal safety. Today we ask you to take ... STEP ONE.

FLOOD GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES WITH LETTERS NOW!

Our local agencies can only go so far without permanent legislative change. We want encampments in the river to be removed, to be legally prohibited and enforced with regular patrols. We are also firmly in support of creating an alternative designated safe and decent shelter. This legislative change needs to involve not only Local government, but also State and Federal levels.

Attached we have provided you with

- 1) a pre-scripted letter that you can sign and mail via USPS and
- 2) a list of six different governmental representatives that we are asking you mail these letters to.

This plan requires that you print six copies of the letters, one for each representative.

*Please note: If you have more than one adult in your household, please repeat this process for each adult to increase the effectiveness of our campaign.

If you have children in your household and want to begin to teach them a civics lesson, please feel free to have them compose their own letters or drawings and include those with your mailings. They may not be old enough to vote, but your children certainly are a part of the community represented and their voices should be heard. We suggest that with children the focus be limited simply to "fire safety".

*Also note: A lot of time and effort has gone into the composition of the attached letter. It has been written for your convenience. If, however, you would like to compose your *own* letter, please feel free. The end goal here is to flood these offices with letters. We want a dramatic effect so that attention is focused on OUR issue.

We would appreciate if you could follow up with us and let us know how many letters have been sent from your household. Our goal is for this action to be complete by the Labor Day weekend. A quick reply to this email MTCoveFPAC@gmail.com would be great.
